A campaign working to shift the national narrative regarding veteran employment.

The StoryRight Formula



StoryRight workshops are values-driven: we respect and value everyone in the room and draw on strengths-based personal development.



The morning covers communication fundamentals: audience analysis, Plain English and skills translation.



We integrate resources from the Australian Defence College and refer attendees to trusted resources and employment support organisations.



The afternoon moves on to drafting a personal 'bio' for use in a resumé or LinkedIn profile, followed by interview coaching.

Theoretical Foundation

- StoryRight workshop content is cross-disciplinary, drawing on communication theory, journalistic principles, solutions-based CBT and narrative therapy.
- Workshops do not aim or claim to be therapeutic, but feedback suggests they have a therapeutic effect for some participants and mentors.
- MindRight workshops to be launched in 2020 will draw on the work of Dr Paula Dabovich, helping veterans in transition to understand shifts in identity.

Our Success Rate

- Of our 75 graduates:
 - 20 are not yet planning to leave the ADF
 - 35 are still 'in' and preparing to separate shortly, with StoryRight support
 - 7 are no longer in touch with us, so we do not have their current data
 - 13 have now left the ADF and secured jobs or study as a result of StoryRight
- We have a 100% satisfaction rate from our workshop attendees.
